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Waiting lists

Jimbelunga continues to prioritise the admission of the most vulnerable members of our community. This includes those suffering chronic disease including diabetes, cardiovascular disease, kidney disease, cancers and liver disease as well as those with mental health concerns and palliative care needs. Jimbelunga has an extensive waiting list for both male and female residents and continues to grow. We pride ourselves on word of mouth throughout our local communities and hospitals. Our services range from low care patients who require minimal assistance through to people who are in hospital or at home with full-time carers and require a high level of clinical care. We also have daily enquiries for care both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people.

Increase in referrals

There has been a significant increase in the number of referrals for admission to Jimbelunga Nursing Centre. Our practice nurses, social workers and IUIH staff work together to place people in the community into our care.

- Increase staff numbers to 94 to ensure our residents get the best possible care around the clock
- With 47% Indigenous residents we continue to plan ahead and work with our community for the placement of residents in our care
