Jimbelunga laundry staff label all new clothing as they arrive at Jimbelunga. Our laundry staff label them and then redistribute to the correct resident. If you have any lost clothing items please see the laundry staff for assistance.

Taking residents out of Jimbelunga

If you are taking a resident out of the building it is essential that our staff are informed. Our policy requires documentation when residents are away from the facility.

Visiting Jimbelunga

Please sign in and out of Jimbelunga when you are visiting your family member, this is due to safety reasons. The sign in / sign out book is located near front office. We'd also like to let know that when visiting loved ones at Jimbelunga there are light refreshments provided in each kitchenette. Please feel free to access tea, coffee, milk, sugar and biscuits which are in containers in the cupboards. We hope you will enjoy a nice cuppa with your loved ones.
