The weather is getting chilly and that means it's time to book in your flu shot to help keep yourself and our community safe.

The flu can be serious for our old people. Getting your flu shot helps stop the spread.

Even if you're young and healthy, the flu can make you really crook for a couple of weeks. If you pass it onto our old people, jarjums (children), pregnant mums and people with chronic conditions, they can end up seriously crook.

Help protect our community this flu season. Book a flu shot through your local clinic.

Online safety tips

We use phones and other devices to shop, yarn, pay bills, watch videos and stay connected. But with cyber threats on the rise, it's important to stay alert!

Scammers and hackers can:

- Steal your identity
- Take your money
- Access your personal information
- Trick your friends and family with fake messages or calls

There are a few simple ways we can protect ourselves and our community online.

1) Add an extra layer of security

Multi-factor authentication (MFA) is a way of adding extra protection to your online accounts like your email, bank or social media. It means you need more than just a password to log in, you may need a code to log in as well. This code may be sent to your phone or email.

2) Keep your apps updated

Apps need to be updated regularly to keep your devices secure. Turn on automatic updates in your settings and don't ignore update reminders.

3) Use strong passphrases

A passphrase is different to a password and is more secure. Passphrases are made up of four or more random words. They are at least 14 characters long.

Example:

Password: Brissy24 (this would be easy to guess)

Passphrase: BlueDeadlyBrissyStar (much longer and harder to guess)

We'll be holding a workshop for residents about cyber safety in June so stay tuned for more information.


